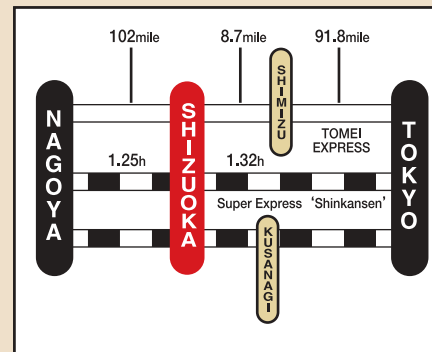
Access

Access Map

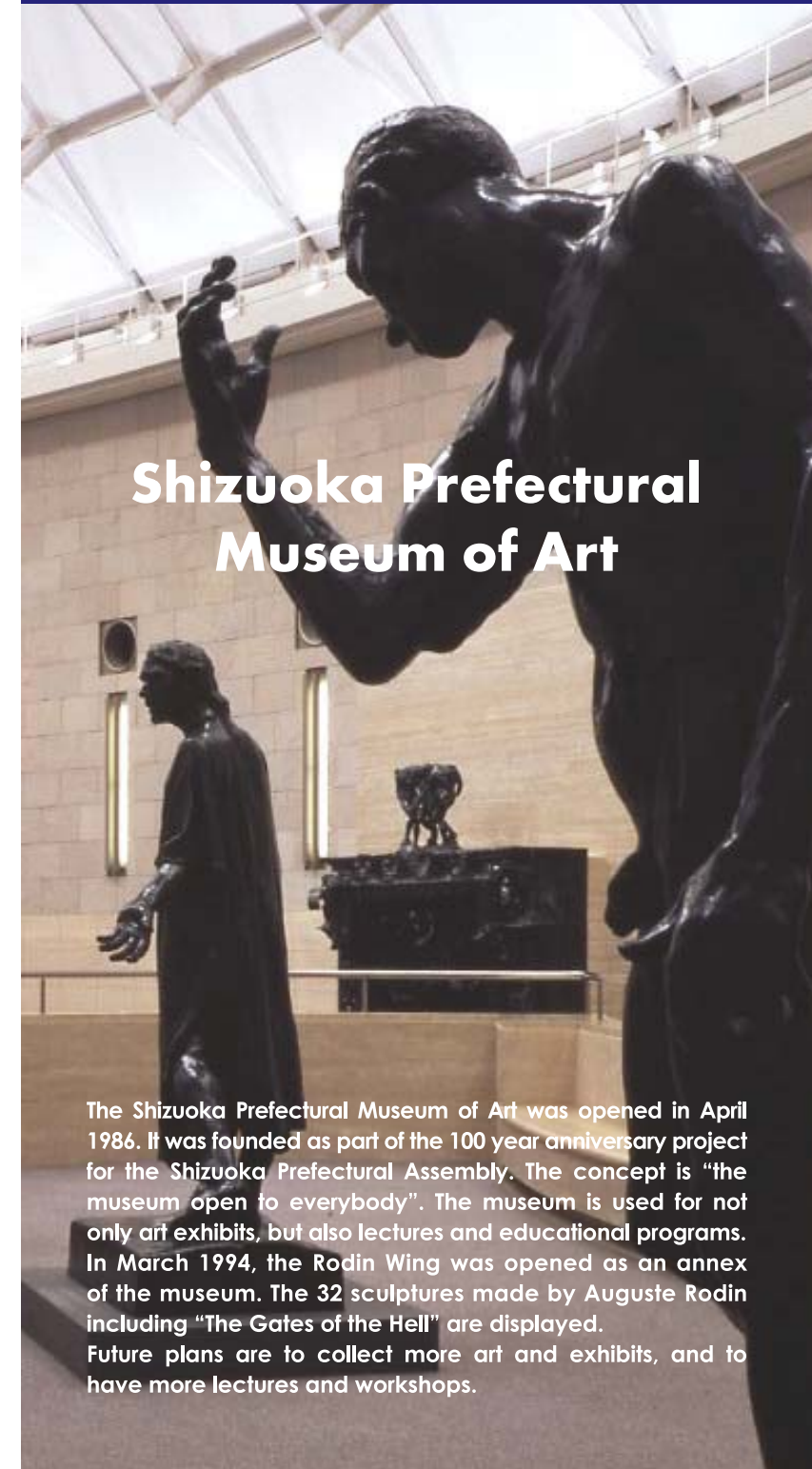

Shizuoka Prefectural Museum of Art

The Shizuoka Prefectural Museum of Art was opened in April 1986. It was founded as part of the 100 year anniversary project for the Shizuoka Prefectural Assembly. The concept is "the museum open to everybody". The museum is used for not only art exhibits, but also lectures and educational programs. In March 1994, the Rodin Wing was opened as an annex of the museum. The 32 sculptures made by Auguste Rodin including "The Gates of the Hell" are displayed. Future plans are to collect more art and exhibits, and to have more lectures and workshops.

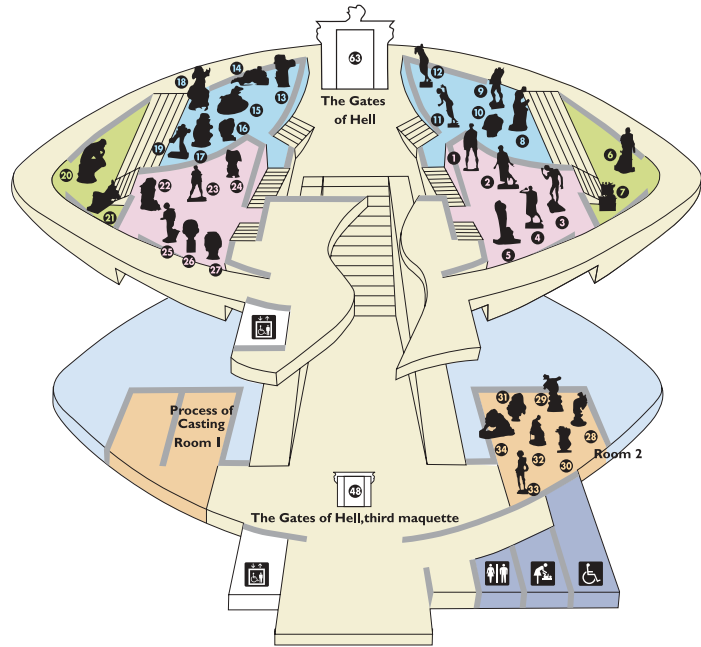
